

Critical Behavior Interviewing



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A job interviewing technique whereby the applicant is asked to describe past behavior in order to determine whether she is suitable for a position. For example, an interviewer may ask "Tell me about a time when you dealt with a disruptive customer". Responses are expected to give an indication of an applicant's professional conduct.

Behavioral interviewing is a style of interviewing developed in the 1970's by industrial psychologists. The theory behind behavioral interviewing is that "the most accurate predictor of future performance is past performance in a similar situation".

Because past performance is a predictor of future behavior, a BEI attempts to uncover your past performance by asking open-ended question. Questions are designed to help the interviewer(s) learn about your past experience in a key skill area that is critical to success in the position for which you are interviewing.
